



# DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Easterlies in Region XII

as of 05 May 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

Based on the 24-Hour Public Weather Forecast issued by DOST-PAGASA on 29 April 2023 at 4PM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms due to easterlies / localized thunderstorms may have brought possible flashfloods or landslides during severe thunderstorms to Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

On the same day at around 6PM, several barangays in the Municipalities of Norala, South Cotabato and President Quirino, Sultan Kudarat experienced heavy rains and strong winds caused by easterlies.
