

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of LPA

as of 04 May 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 04 May 2023 at 4PM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 125 km East of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (9.9°N, 119.9°E). It is embedded along the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.
