- ₱350.85 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO X warehouses.

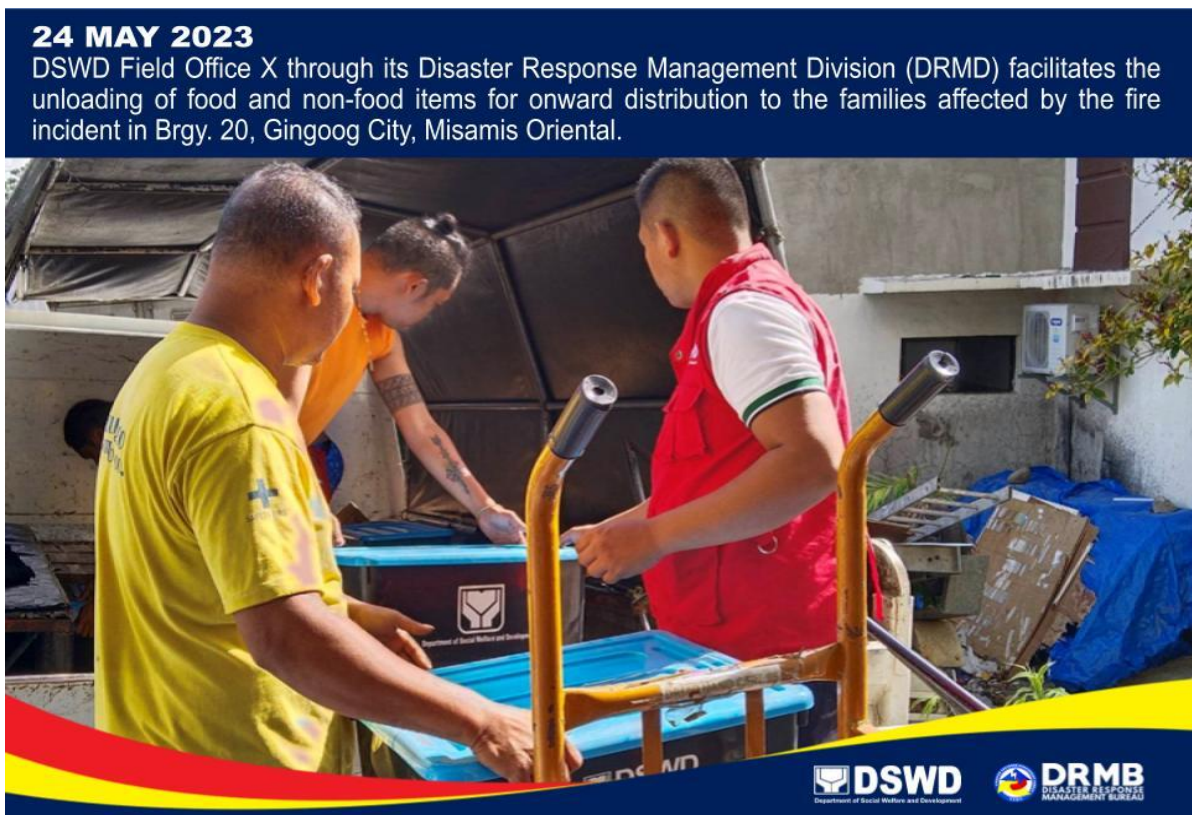
