



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Brgy. Calapagan, Lupon, Davao Oriental

as of 25 May 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 23 May 2023 at 4PM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by Southwesterly Windflow/Localized Thunderstorms may have brought possible flashfloods or landslides during severe thunderstorms to Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

On the same day at around 4:30 PM, a flooding incident occurred at Purok Sarmiento, Brgy. Calapagan, Lupon, Davao Oriental.
