

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Maasin, Iloilo

as of 18 May 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 13 May 2023 partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by ITCZ / Localized Thunderstorms may have brought possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

On the same day at around 3:00PM, several barangays in the municipality of Maasin, Iloilo experienced flooding due to heavy rains.

A total of **54 families** or **270 persons** are affected in **five (5) barangays** in **Maasin, Iloilo** (see Table 1).
