

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Landslide Incident in Brgy. Bonbonon, Iligan City, Lanao del Norte

as of 25 May 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 08 March 2023 at 4AM, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by Localized Thunderstorms may have brought possible flashfloods or landslides during severe thunderstorms to Mindanao and the rest of Visayas.

On the same day, a landslide incident occurred in Brgy. Bonbonon, Iligan City, Lanao del Norte.
