### I. Situation Overview

On 07 May 2023 at 4PM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 410 km North Northeast of Pagasa Island, Palawan (14.5°N, 115.6°E).



A total of **4,504 families** or **19,017 persons** sought temporary shelter in **138 evacuation centers** in **Region VI** (see Table 2).
