

## DSWD DROMIC Report #15 on the Effects of LPA as of 31 May 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 07 May 2023 at 4PM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 410 km North Northeast of Pagasa Island, Palawan (14.5°N, 115.6°E).

### II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

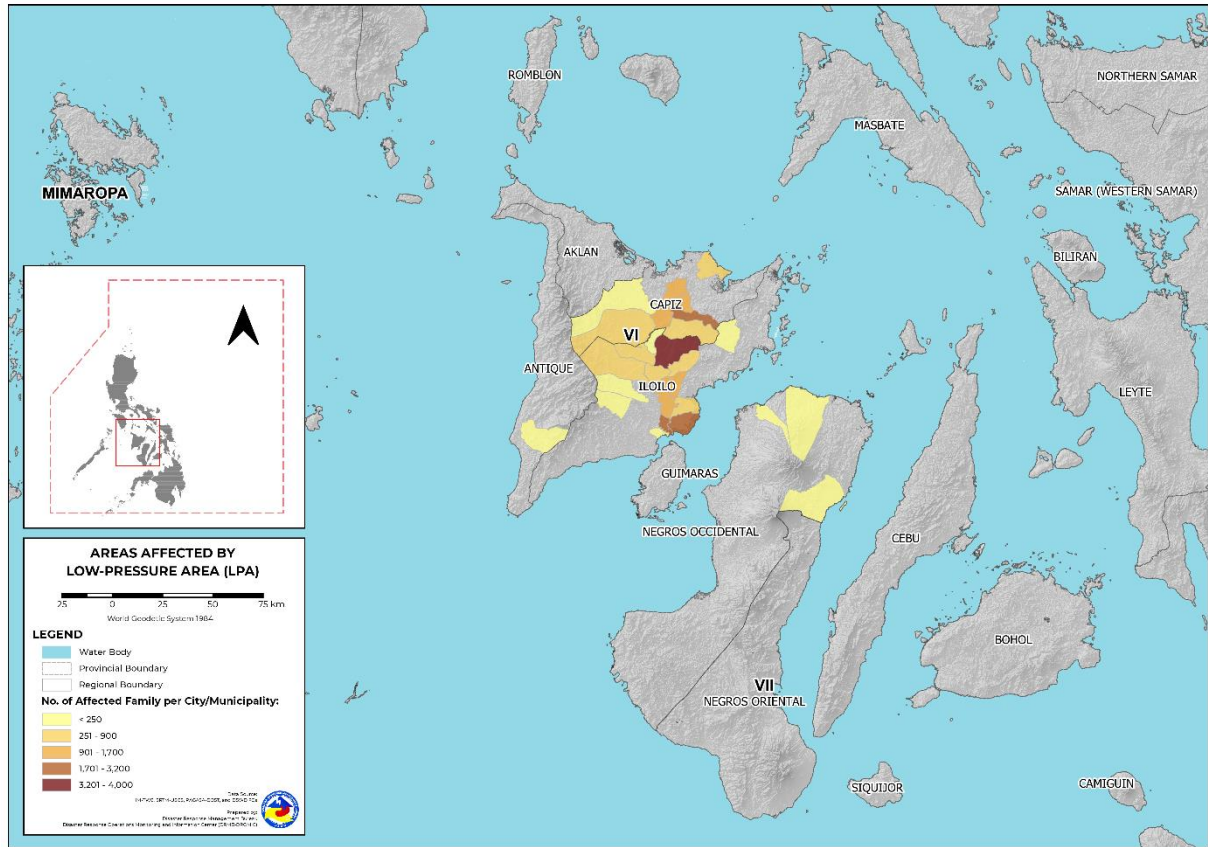
A total of **23,144 families** or **92,022 persons** are affected in **280 barangays** in **Region VI** (see Table 1).
