



DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Armed Conflict in Brgy. Hilamonan, Kabankalan City, Negros Occidental

as of 14 May 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 11 May 2023 at around 4:30 PM, an armed conflict transpired between the troops of the Philippine Army and members of the New People's Army (NPA) in Brgy. Hilamnonan, Kabankalan City that also affected the nearby Brgy. Buenavista of Himamaylan City in Negros Occidental.

IV. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱305,047.00 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱216,537.00 was provided by DSWD, and ₱88,510.00 was provided by the Local Government Units (LGU) to the affected families (see Table 5).
