I. Situation Overview

Issued on 05 May 2023 at 4PM, the low pressure area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 75 km West Northwest of Puerto Princesa City, Palawan (9.9°N, 118.1°E).

04 May 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> DSWD FO MIMAROPA alerted its Social Welfare and Development (SWAD) Offices to monitor daily local weather conditions and related eventualities, and ensure dissemination of information to all concerned offices, divisions, sections, and units. The Regional, Provincial, City, and Municipal Quick Response Teams (QRTs) were placed on an alert status for possible activation of the Operations Center to respond in case of any untoward incident or eventuality. DSWD FO MIMAROPA, in coordination with SWAD Offices and concerned LGUs, ensured availability of logistical equipment and workforce for the management of stranded passengers in ports and terminals. DSWD FO MIMAROPA closely coordinated with the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) and the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) MIMAROPA in monitoring the areas that may be affected by the weather disturbance and for effective response mechanism and updating. DSWD FO MIMAROPA ensured adherence to the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) guidelines on COVID-19 Preparedness Measure.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with concerned DSWD FOs for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.

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
