

## DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by STY “Betty” as of 30 May 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 30 May 2023 at 4:00 PM, the center of the eye of Typhoon "BETTY" {MAWAR} was estimated based on all available data at 315 km East of Basco, Batanes (20.6°N, 125.0°E) with maximum sustained winds of 150 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 185 km/h. It is moving Northward slowly. Southwest Monsoon affecting Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.

Cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms caused by Southwest Monsoon / TY BETTY may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate to at times heavy rains to MIMAROPA, Western Visayas, Zamboanga Peninsula, the rest of Ilocos Region, of Cordillera Administrative Region, and of Cagayan Valley.

##### 1. Standby Funds

- ₱338.96 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.

- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱68.32 million available in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by STY “Betty” through inter-FO augmentation.

**2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items**

- 97,818 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 31,277 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 66,542 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 73,061 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- 757,327 FFPs available in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by STY “Betty” through inter-FO augmentation.
