## I. Situation Overview

On 14 May 2023 at around 2:49 AM, a fire incident occurred at Oroquieta St., Brgy. 310, Sta. Cruz, Manila City. The fire was declared out at around 1PM.

- 42,229 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 33,087 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 9,142 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 1,200 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱222.25 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.
