

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Don Bosco, Parañaque City as of 06 May 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 04 May 2023 at around 12:16 AM, a fire incident occurred at Russia St., Better Living, Brgy. Don Bosco, Parañaque City. The fire was declared out at 4:46 AM.
