

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Social Disorganization in Sadanga, Mountain Province

as of 18 August 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 08 May 2023, the Municipality of Sadanga, Mountain Province was placed under state of calamity (SOC) due to the social disorganization caused by the long-time dispute between the tribes of Brgy. Betwagan and Brgy. Bekigan in Sadanga, Mountain Province and Brgy. But-but in Tinglayan, Kalinga.

The situation recently escalated as crime-related incidents connected to the conflict have been reported. According to the Sangguniang Bayan (SB) Resolution No. 51 series of 2023, the conflict and its related incidents “*created extraordinary fear and panic*” and “*disrupted the normal socio-economic activities*” of the families and persons in the affected communities.

On 17 August 2023, another incident related to the long-time dispute between the tribes occurred in Brgy. Bekigan, Sadanga resulting into one (1) casualty.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **570 families** or **3,041 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Sadanga, Mountain Province** (see Table 1).
