

## DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Armed Conflict in Brgy. Hilamonan, Kabankalan City as of 06 May 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 03 May 2023 at around 4PM, an armed conflict between the Philippine Army and the New People's Army (NPA) transpired in Brgy. Hilamonan, Kabankalan City and Brgy. Buenavista, Himamaylan City in Negros Occidental which resulted in the displacement of families and individuals in the area.

A total of **314 families** or **1,493 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 1).

### III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **299 families** or **1,433 persons** sought temporary shelter in **four (4) evacuation centers** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 2).
