

DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Armed Conflict in Moises Padilla and Isabela, Negros Occidental

as of 23 May, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 20 May 2023 at around 5:00 AM, an armed conflict transpired at the boundaries of Brgy. Quintin Remo, Moises Padilla and Brgy. Sebacauan, Isabela, Negros Occidental between the Government Troops (Philippine Army) and the members of the New People's Army (NPA).

A total of **318 families** or **1,199 persons** are affected in **Moises Padilla** and **Isabela, Negros Occidental** (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **291 families** or **1,091 persons** sought temporary shelter in **four (4) evacuation centers** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 2).
