



DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Flashflood Incidents in Region XII

as of 19 May 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 15 May 2023, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by the Southwesterly Surface Windflow / Localized may have brought possible flashfloods or landslides during severe thunderstorms to Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

On the same day, several municipalities in the provinces of Sultan Kudarat, South Cotabato, and Cotabato Province experienced flashfloods.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱878.99 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO XII.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 89,229 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 80,087 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 9,142 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 22,906 FFPs available at DSWD FO XII.
- ₱276.79 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO XII warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

18 May 2023	DSWD FO XII facilitated the distribution of FFPs, plastic mats and malong to the affected families in Lutayan, Sultan Kudarat.
15 May 2023	 The LGU of Koronadal City and South Cotabato provided hot meals, food packs, drinking water, kitchen kits, hygiene kits and medicine to the affected families. The LGU of Lutayan provided relief food packs to the displaced families or persons inside evacuation centers.
