

DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Flooding Incident in Davao del Norte

as of 22 May 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 14 May 2023, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rain showers or thunderstorms caused by the ITCZ / Localized Thunderstorms may have caused possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms.

On 14-15 May 2023, flooding was experienced in several barangays in the municipality of Sto. Tomas and Carmen, Davao del Norte.

A total of **3,583 families** or **10,789 persons** are affected in **10 barangays** in **Davao del Norte** (see Table 1).
