



DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Ground Fissure along the Palampas River in Brgy. 1 (Poblacion), San Carlos City, Negros Occidental

as of 09 June 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 13 May 2023 at around 2PM, families and individuals residing at Purok Tindalo, Brgy. 1 (Poblacion), San Carlos City, Negros Occidental were evacuated after a portion of a nearby retaining wall along the Palampas River showed signs of a potential collapse as ground fissures grew and the soil began to sink in the area.

Personnel from the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), City Engineer's Office, and a risk assessment team from the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (CDRRMO) investigated the area and reported that massive cracks were also seen in the adjacent houses located beside the retaining wall.

In a statement, the City Engineer's Office has already declared the area as not safe for the residents.
