



DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Armed Conflict in Brgy. Hilamonan, Kabankalan City

as of 07 May 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 03 May 2023 at around 4PM, an armed conflict between the Philippine Army and the New People's Army (NPA) transpired in Brgy. Hilamonan, Kabankalan City and Brgy. Buenavista, Himamaylan City in Negros Occidental which resulted in the displacement of families and individuals in the area.

A total of **334 families** or **1,560 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 1).

A total of **319 families** or **1,500 persons** sought temporary shelter in **four (4) evacuation centers** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 2).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱27.22 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VI.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 40,217 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 18,589 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 21,628 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 79,779 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱200.38 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VI warehouses.
