I. Situation Overview

Issued on 07 May 2023 at 4PM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 410 km North Northeast of Pagasa Island, Palawan (14.5°N, 115.6°E).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱27.22 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱76.26 million available in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to LPA through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 40,217 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 18,589 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 21,628 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 79,779 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- 594,792 FFPs in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to LPA through inter-FO augmentation.

04 May 2023	 DSWD FO MIMAROPA alerted its Social Welfare and Development (SWAD) Offices to monitor daily local weather conditions and related eventualities, and ensure dissemination of information to all concerned offices, divisions, sections, and units. The Regional, Provincial, City, and Municipal Quick Response Teams (QRTs) were placed on an alert status for possible activation of the Operations Center to respond in case of any untoward incident or eventuality. DSWD FO MIMAROPA, in coordination with SWAD Offices and concerned LGUs, ensured availability of logistical equipment and workforce for the management of stranded passengers in ports and terminals. DSWD FO MIMAROPA closely coordinated with the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) and the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) MIMAROPA in monitoring the areas that may be affected by the weather disturbance and for effective response mechanism and updating. DSWD FO MIMAROPA ensured adherence to the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) 	
	guidelines on COVID-19 Preparedness Measure.

The Rapid Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis (RDANA) Team of DSWD FO VI are ready for deployment as need arises. DSWD FO VI continuously monitored the weather updates from DOST-PAGASA for dissemination to the Regional, Provincial, City, and Municipal QRTs. DSWD FO VI closely coordinated with the LGUs for any reports on affected and displaced population due to LPA. DSWD FO VI continuously repacked FFPs at the Regional warehouse in Oton, Iloilo. DSWD FO VI continuously conducted prepositioning and stockpiling of FNIs in strategic areas within the Region.
