I. Situation Overview

On 15 May 2023 at around 3:12 PM, a fire incident occurred in barangays Talon Uno and Talon Singko, Las Piñas City. The fire was declared out at around 9:30 PM.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱130.78 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱4.9 million available at DSWD FO NCR.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 187,960 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 100,918 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 87,042 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 6,539 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱249.72 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)
