

DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Talon Uno and Brgy. Talon Singko, Las Piñas City as of 15 June 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 15 May 2023 at around 3:12 PM, a fire incident occurred in barangays Talon Uno and Talon Singko, Las Piñas City. The fire was declared out at around 9:30 PM.
