## I. Situation Overview

O 07 May 2023 at 4PM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 410 km North Northeast of Pagasa Island, Palawan (14.5°N, 115.6°E).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of ₱15,244,441.84 worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, ₱13,110,031.74 from DSWD and ₱2,134,410.10 from the Local Government Units (LGUs) (see Table 6).

- ₱73.97 million available in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to LPA through inter-FO augmentation.
