

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the African Swine Fever Outbreak in Aklan

as of 11 June 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 19 May 2023, the province of Aklan was placed under State of Calamity due to the outbreak of the African Swine Fever (ASF) after several cases were confirmed in the province.

ASF is a highly contagious viral disease of domestic and wild pigs, whose mortality rate can reach 100%. It is not a danger to human health, but it has devastating effects on pig populations and the farming economy. There is currently no effective vaccine against ASF. The virus is highly resistant in the environment, meaning that it can survive on clothes, boots, wheels, and other materials. It can also survive in various pork products, such as ham, sausages or bacon.

A total of **2,609 families** or **13,265 persons** are affected in **38 barangays** in **Aklan** (see Table 1).
