



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone

as of 20 June 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 19 June 2023, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) or localized thunderstorms may have brought possible flashfloods or landslides during severe thunderstorms to Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

On the same day, the Municipalities of Kiblawan, Matanao, Sulop, and Dagos City experienced flashfloods while the Municipality of Santa Cruz experienced flooding, all in the Province of Davao del Sur.
