On 14 June 2023 at around 11:21 AM, a fire incident occurred at Blk. 19, Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City. The fire was declared out at around 1:06 PM.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱130.78 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 185,055 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 98,013 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 87,042 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 6,539 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱256.4 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.





b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

	 The LGU of Mandaluyong through its CSWDO provided hot meals and other basic needs to the affected families. Also, the same office facilitated the distribution of various donations to the affected families.

DSWD FO NCR through the Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) conducted Rapid Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis (RDANA). DSWD FO NCR ensured the availability of FNIs for possible additional relief augmentation to the LGU of Mandaluyong City.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO NCR for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
