



# DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone

as of 24 June 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

Issued on 22 June 2023 at 4AM, Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) affecting Palawan, Visayas, and Mindanao.

On 19 June 2023, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms caused by the ITCZ or localized thunderstorms have brought possible flashfloods or landslides during severe thunderstorms to Metro Manila and the rest of the country. On the same day, the Municipalities of Kiblawan, Matanao, Sulop, and Dagos City experienced flashfloods while the Municipality of Santa Cruz experienced flooding, all in the Province of Davao del Sur.

There are **198 families** or **964 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **four (4) evacuation centers** in **Regions IX**, **X**, **XI**, and **XII** (see Table 2).

### 1. Standby Funds

- ₱826.64 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱16.24 million available at DSWD FOs IX, X, XI, and XII.
- ₱61.38 million available in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.

#### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 233,641 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 137,099 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 96,542 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 170,306 FFPs available at DSWD FOs IX, X, XI, and XII.
- 806,306 FFPs available in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱1.05 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses.
