

DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Effects of Localized Thunderstorms in Davao Region as of 27 June 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On June 05 to 07, 2023, the Davao Region experienced partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers due to localized thunderstorms causing flash floods and flooding in several municipalities in the provinces of Davao de Oro, Davao del Norte, and Davao Oriental.

A total of **20 families** or **39 persons** sought temporary shelter in **one (1) evacuation center** in **Nabunturan, Davao de Oro** (see Table 2).
