I. Situation Overview

Issued on 04 June 2023 at 4PM, the Southwest Monsoon affects the western sections of Central and Southern Luzon.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱146.78 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱71.97 million available in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by STY “Betty” through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items
