



DSWD DROMIC Report #7 on the Effects of Localized Thunderstorms in Davao Region

as of 05 July 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On June 05 to 07, 2023, the Davao Region experienced partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers due to localized thunderstorms causing flash floods and flooding in several municipalities in the provinces of Davao de Oro, Davao del Norte, and Davao Oriental.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱247.56 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO XI.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 189,222 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 111,380 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 77,842 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 54,270 FFPs available at DSWD FO XI.
- ₱276.69 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO XI warehouses.

c. Other Activities

05 July 2023	DSWD FO XI closely coordinates with the concerned LGUs through their respective Municipal Social Welfare and Development Offices (MSWDOs) and Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices (MDRRMOs) for significant updates and any request for relief augmentation.
06 June 2023	DSWD FO XI, through its Disaster Response and Management Division (DRMD), conducted site visit and assessment of the needs of the affected families.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO XI for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
