I. Situation Overview

Issued on 27 June 2023 at 4AM, the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) continuously affected Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱826.64 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱22.22 million available at DSWD FOs IX, X, XI, XII, and CARAGA.
- ₱55.4 million available in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the displaced families due to the effects of ITCZ through inter-FO augmentation.
