

DSWD DROMIC Report #8 on the Effects of Intertropical Convergence Zone as of 27 June 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 27 June 2023 at 4AM, the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) continuously affected Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.
