



DSWD DROMIC Report #9 on the Mayon Volcanic Activity

as of 16 June 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

- As of 16 June 2023 at 8AM, Alert Level 3 is maintained over Mayon Volcano, which means that it is currently in a relatively high level of unrest as magma is at the crater and hazardous eruption within weeks or even days is possible.
- In the past 24-hour period, very slow effusion of lava from the summit crater of Mayon Volcano continued to feed lava flows and collapse debris on the Mi-isi (south) and Bonga (southeastern) gullies. The lava flows have advanced to approximately one (1) kilometer from the summit crater while collapse debris have deposited to two (2) kilometers from the crater. A total of thirteen (13) domecollapse pyroclastic density currents (PDC), three-hundred seven (307) rockfall events, and four (4) volcanic earthquakes were recorded by the Mayon Volcano Network. PDCs lasted two (2) to six (6) minutes and were emplaced on the Mi-isi and Bonga Gullies within one (1) kilometer of the crater. The largest PDC event since 8 Jun 2023 occurred at 11:18 PM on 15 June and deposited material within the upper one (1) kilometer of these gullies. Traces of ashfall dispersed from the PDCs were reported in Sitio Buga, Brgy. Nabonton, City of Ligao and Purok 7, Brgy. San Francisco, Municipality of Guinobatan. Continuous moderate degassing from the summit crater produced steam-laden plumes that rose 750 m before drifting to the general west and north-northeast. Sulfur dioxide (SO2) emission averaged 826 tonnes/day on 15 June 2023. Short-term observations from EDM and electronic tiltmeter monitoring show the upper slopes to be inflating since February 2023. Longer-term ground deformation parameters based on EDM, precise leveling, continuous GPS, and electronic tilt monitoring indicate that Mayon is still inflated, especially on the northwest and southeast.
- It is therefore recommended that the 6-km radius Permanent Danger Zone (PDZ) be evacuated due to the danger of PDCs, lava flows, rockfalls and other volcanic hazards.
- Increased vigilance against pyroclastic density currents, lahars and sedimentladen streamflows along channels draining the edifice is also advised. Heavy rainfall could generate channel-confined lahars and sediment-laden streamflows in channels where PDC deposits were emplaced.
- Civil aviation authorities must also advise pilots to avoid flying close to the volcano's summit as ash from any sudden eruption can be hazardous to aircraft.
 Based on the current prevailing wind pattern, ash fall events may most likely occur on the south side of the volcano.



DSWD FO V conducted a meeting to discuss CCCM, psychosocial activities, areas of assignment, issues and concerns relative to the Mayon Volcano operations, and other matters.
11 June 2023	 DSWD FO V in coordination with the Provincial Government of Albay prepositioned FNIs and ensured the preparation of the families affected by the Mayon volcanic activity. DSWD FO V Quick Response Team (QRT) continuously monitored the situation of the families affected by the Mayon volcanic activity in Albay. The Regional Resource Operations Section (RROS) of DSWD FO V ensured the availability of NFIs. DSWD FO V through its Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) continuously monitored the situation and coordinated with other partners for other essential information. DSWD FO V continuously coordinated with the Provincial Government of Albay through its Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO) and Albay Public Safety and Emergency Management Office (APSEMO) for significant updates.
10 June 2023	DSWD Field Office V facilitated the unloading of NFIs at the DSWD Regional Warehouse in Pawa, Legazpi City, Albay as augmentation support to the LGUs affected by the Mayon volcanic activity.
09 June 2023	 The MATs were on a 24/7 shift to ensure that all concerns and needs of the IDPs would be addressed, reported, and referred to concerned offices and agencies. DSWD FO V attended the Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (RDRRMC) Emergency Meeting at the Office of Cvil Defense (OCD 5), Handying Hall, Camp Gen. Simeon Ola, Legazpi City.
08 June 2023	 DSWD FO V facilitated the identification of additional warehouses for prepositioning of FNIs. DSWD FO V attended the inter-agency emergency meeting on the preparedness for response actions/activities of concerned offices relative to the raising of alert status of Mayon Volcano.
07 June 2023	 DSWD FO V through its DRMD led a meeting with the City and Municipal Action team (C/MAT) leaders and members to discuss on the preparedness for response actions relative to the potential impacts of the ongoing unrest activities of the Mayon Volcano. DSWD FO V activated its QRT – Social Welfare and Development Team (SWADT) in Albay. DSWD FO V inspected 115 evacuation centers in preparation for any possible evacuation. DSWD FO V led the monitoring of the delivery of 21,000 FFPs from DSWD-NRLMB to DSWD FO V new warehouse in Camalig, Albay.
