



DSWD DROMIC Report on the Effects of African Swine Fever in Buenavista, Guimaras

29 June 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 16 December 2022, a case of African Swine Fever (ASF) was detected in the municipality of Buenavista in Guimaras which prompted the province to issue Executive Order No. 118 that mandated a transport ban on swine and pork products. According to the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) of Buenavista, the effects of ASF affected the livelihood of the families / persons engaged in businesses related to swine growing, production and trading.

ASF is a highly contagious viral disease of domestic and wild pigs, whose mortality rate can reach 100%. It is not a danger to human health, but it has devastating effects on pig populations and the farming economy. There is currently no effective vaccine against ASF. The virus is highly resistant in the environment, meaning that it can survive on clothes, boots, wheels, and other materials. It can also survive in various pork products, such as ham, sausages or bacon.
