



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Armed Conflict in Sallapadan, Abra

as of 22 July 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 26 June 2023 at around 1:45 PM, an armed conflict transpired at Sitio Mangmangga, Brgy. Naguilian, Sallapadan, Abra between the troops of the 102nd Infantry Battalion (IB) of the Philippine Army and members of the Komiteng Larangang Guerilla (KLG) North Abra.

On 28 June 2023 at around 2:30 PM, another encounter occurred at Sitio Bonbontukan, Brgy. Naguilian, Sallapadan, Abra between the troops of 24th IB of the Philippine Army and members of the Regional Sentro De Grabidad Ilocos-Cordillera Regional Committee (RSDG-ICRC).

Reports indicate that these conflicts prompted the LGU of Sallapadan, Abra to take extra measures in ensuring the safety of the families in the affected areas by implementing restricted movements in and out of the municipality. Further, the heightened tension and restrictions lead to the isolation of the community resulting in significant disruptions in the livelihood and daily activities of the families residing in the affected areas.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 2,039 families or 7,823 persons are affected in nine (9) barangays in Sallapadan, Abra (see Table 1).

DSWD FO CAR ensured the availability of FNIs at the regional and satellite warehouses. DSWD FO CAR ensured the availability of transportation and communication services ready for possible deployment when needed. DSWD FO CAR immediately processed the LGU request for augmentation and schedule of delivery.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO CAR for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
