

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Fairview, Quezon City as of 03 July 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 01 July 2023 at around 5:15 PM, a fire incident occurred at Jaguar St., Brgy. Fairview, Quezon City. The fire was declared out at around 7:45 PM.
