

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Santa Cruz, Davao del Sur as of 04 July 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 02 July 2023, the Davao Region experienced partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms due to easterlies that caused flooding in several barangays in the Municipality of Santa Cruz, Davao del Sur.

A total of **1,031 families** or **5,150 persons** are affected in **three (3) barangays** in **Santa Cruz, Davao del Sur** (see Table 1).

#### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 202,138 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 129,296 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 72,842 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.

- 54,270 FFPs available at DSWD FO XI.
- ₱276.88 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO XI warehouses.
