

## DSWD DROMIC Report #12 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon “Egay” as of 01 August 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 27 July 2023, “Egay” maintained its strength as it moved West Northwestward and exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

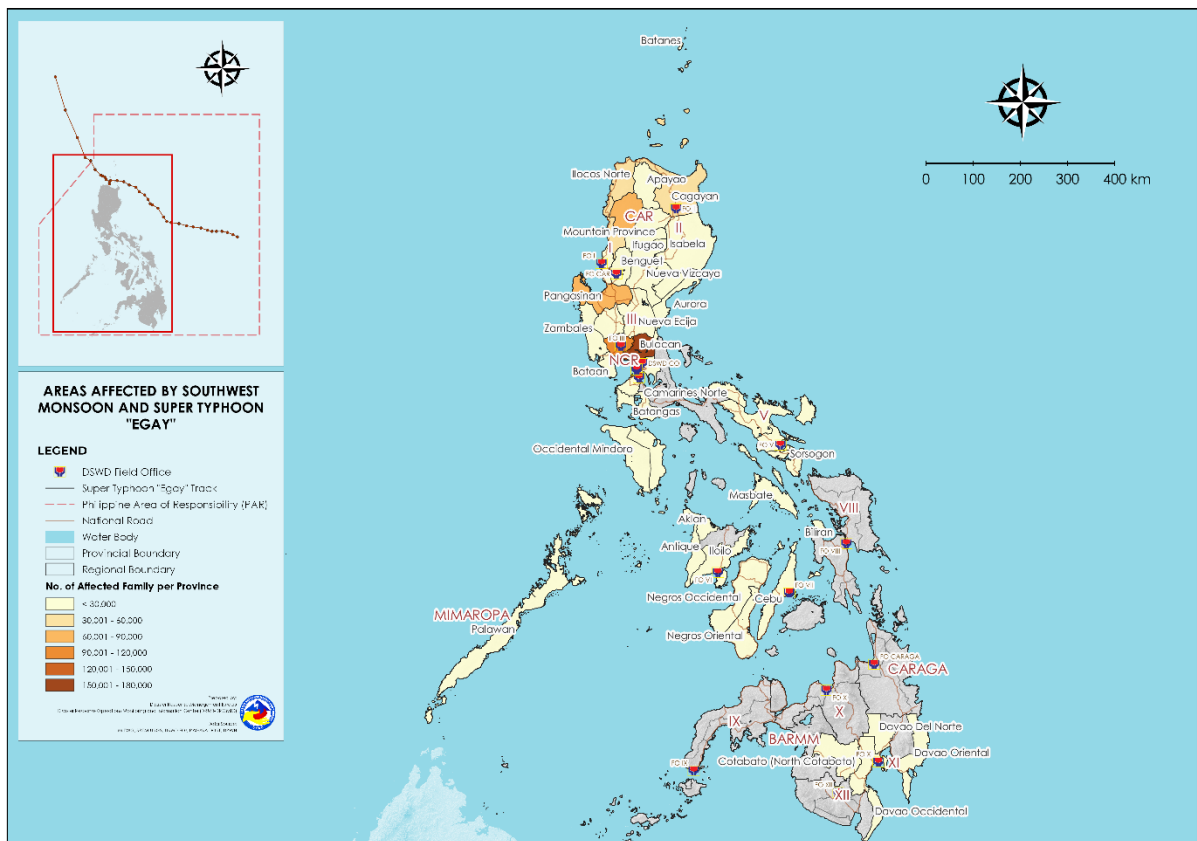

There are **12,285 families** or **45,580 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **524 evacuation centers** in Regions **NCR, CAR, I, III, CALABARZON, V, VI** and **XII** (see Table 2).

## V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱187,265,680.18** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱164,533,486.97** from **DSWD**, **₱20,511,310.11** from the **Local Government Units (LGUs)**, **₱128,406.01** from the **Non-Government Organizations** and **₱2,092,477.09** from the **other Partners** (see Table 6).
