



DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flash Flood Incidents in North Cotabato

as of 06 July 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 05 July 2023, several low-lying barangays in the municipalities of President Roxas and Kabacan in the province of North Cotabato experienced flash floods caused by heavy rains brought by the Easterlies.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **1,554 families** or **7,542 persons** are affected in **12 barangays** in **North Cotabato** (see Table 1).

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 189,307 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 111,465 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 77,842 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 24,015 FFPs available at DSWD FO XII.
- ₱281.62 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO XII warehouses.
