



DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flooding Incidents in Maguindanao

as of 28 July 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 08 July 2023 at 4:00 PM, cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms brought by the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) / Easterlies may have caused possible flash floods or landslides due to scattered moderate to at times heavy rains to Eastern Visayas, Central Visayas, and Mindanao.

On the same day, several municipalities in Maguindanao experienced flooding due to continuous heavy rains brought by the ITCZ.

A total of **36,286 families** or **181,430 persons** are affected in **111 barangays** in **Maguindanao** (see Table 1).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱749.54 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO XII.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 124,759 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 38,631 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City, and 86,128 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 161,526 FFPs available at DSWD FO XII.
- ₱286.23 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO XII warehouses.

b. Other Activities

DATE	ACTIVITIES
28 July 2023	DSWD FO XII continuously coordinates with the affected LGUs through their respective Municipal Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices (MDRRMOs), the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction Management Office (PDRRMO) of Maguindanao, and other concerned offices for significant updates and any request of augmentation.
09 July 2023	 A team from Datu Abdullah Sangki conducted Rapid Damage Assessment and Needs Analysis (RDANA) in the affected areas. The LGU of Talayan and Datu Anggal Midtimbang activated its Emergency Operation Center. The MDRRMO of Datu Hoffer Ampatuan facilitated the provision of FFPs to the affected families.
08 July 2023	The MDRRMO of Guindulungan and the Armed Forces of the
	Philippines (AFP) conducted rescue operations.
