



# DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Flash Flood Incidents in Misamis Oriental

as of 27 July 2023, 6PM

#### I. Situation Overview

On 21 July 2023, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) local weather forecast advisory indicated that Northern Mindanao will experience partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rain showers or thunderstorms due to Southwest Monsoon / Localized Thunderstorms and will bring light to moderate winds from southwest to west with slight to moderate seas. This weather condition may have caused possible flash floods or landslides.

On the same day, the City of Cagayan de Oro and the Municipality of Tagoloan in Misamis Oriental experienced flash floods prompting forced evacuation in the affected areas.

A total of **4,168 families** or **20,686 persons** are affected in **18 barangays** in **Misamis Oriental** (see Table 1).

# III. Status of Displaced Population

#### a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of 117 families or 431 persons sought temporary shelter in four (4) evacuation centers in Misamis Oriental (see Table 2).
