



DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Flash Flood Incidents in Region XII

as of 08 July 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Starting on 02 July 2023 4PM, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) reported that the easterlies had affected several parts of the country.

On 03 July 2023, the Municipality of Tantangan, South Cotabato experienced flash floods due to heavy rains caused by said weather disturbance. On 05 July 2023, several low-lying barangays in the Municipalities of President Roxas and Kabacan in North Cotabato reported incidents of flash flood also caused by heavy rains brought by the easterlies.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 1,648 families or 8,012 persons are affected in 14 barangays in Region XII (see Table 1).

1. Standby Funds

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 137,493 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 108,965 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 28,528 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 24,015 FFPs available at DSWD FO XII.
- ₱279.72 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO XII warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items

05 July 2023	 The LGU of President Roxas, North Cotabato provided hot meals, food packs, and hygiene kits to affected families.
03 July 2023	The LGU of Tantangan, South Cotabato provided food packs to affected families.

c. Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM)

05 July 2023	 The LGU of Kabacan, North Cotabato facilitated the evacuation of families and individuals to higher grounds and provided them with hot meals.


