



DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Effects of African Swine Fever in Region VI

as of 18 July 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

With confirmed cases and reports on the spread of the African Swine Fever (ASF) in Western Visayas (Region VI), the effects of ASF have placed the provinces of Aklan and Capiz as well as the municipality of Hamtic in Antique under the State of Calamity (SoC) on 19 May 2023, 13 June 2023, and 22 June 20223 respectively.

ASF is a highly contagious viral disease of domestic and wild pigs, where the mortality rate can reach 100%. It is not a danger to human health, but it has devastating effects on pig populations and the farming economy. There is currently no effective vaccine against ASF. The virus is highly resistant to the environment, meaning that it can survive on clothes, boots, wheels, and other materials. It can also survive in various pork products, such as ham, sausages, or bacon.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **17,292 families** or **82,188 persons** are affected in **310 barangays** in **Region VI** (see Table 1).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱98.87 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VI.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 149,553 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 95,025 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City, and 54,528 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 62,409 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.

13 July 2023	• DSWD FO VI in coordination with the Municipal Social Welfare and Development Office (MSWDO) of the LGU of Hamtic facilitated the provision of Emergency Cash Transfer (ECT) to the affected families amounting to a total of ₱8,754,538.00.
