

DSWD DROMIC Report #8 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon and Super Typhoon “Egay” as of 28 July 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 27 July 2023 at 11PM, “Egay” maintained its strength as it moved West Northwestward and exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR).

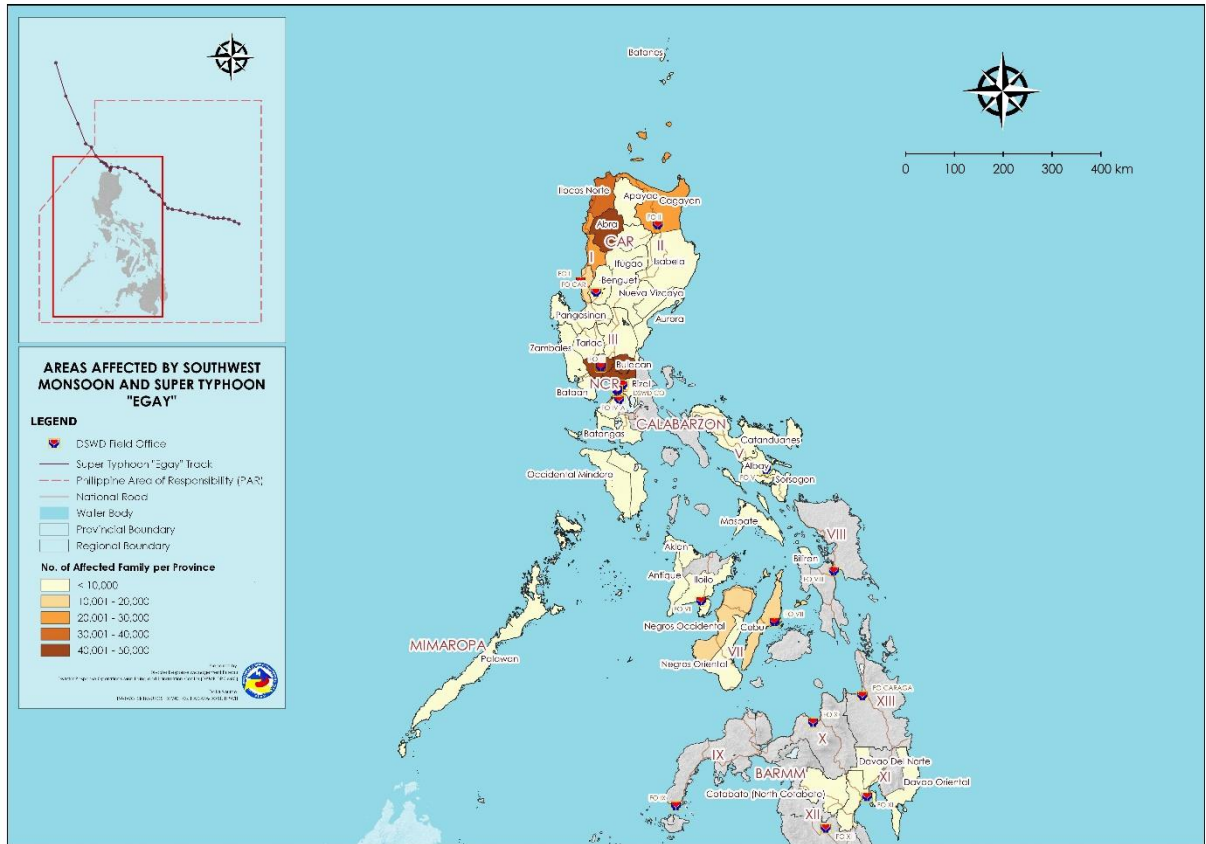
