

DSWD DROMIC Terminal Report on the Effects of Localized Thunderstorms in Davao Region

06 October 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On June 05 to 07, 2023, the Davao Region experienced partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rain showers due to localized thunderstorms causing flash floods and flooding in several municipalities in the provinces of Davao de Oro, Davao del Norte, and Davao Oriental.
