



# DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Capsized Motorboat in Brgy. Pilar, San Antonio, Northern Samar

as of 12 August 2023, 6PM

#### I. Situation Overview

On 02 August 2023 at around 7:52 AM, the motorboat MBCA Spirit capsized along the seaboard of Brgy. Pilar, San Antonio, Northern Samar. According to initial reports from the Philippine Coast Guard (PCG), the MBCA Spirit sailed from Victoria, Northern Samar, and was supposed to drop its passengers in San Vicente but it encountered rough waves that eventually resulted in its malfunctioning.

The Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Offices of the Local Government Units (LGUs) together with the PCG and the Philippine National Police (PNP) lead the rescue operations of the affected passengers and crew members.

A total of **62 families** or **248 individuals** are affected by the capsized motorboat along the seaboard of Brgy. Pilar, San Antonio, Northern Samar (see Table 1).
