

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon

as of 13 August 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 09 August 2023 at 7PM, the Municipality of Sablayan in Occidental Mindoro experienced flooding due to the effects of Southwest Monsoon that resulted in the displacement of families and individuals residing in the affected areas.

On 12 August 2023, several barangays in Zamboanga City also experienced flooding due to continuous heavy rains caused by Southwest Monsoon.

Issued on 13 August 2023 at 4PM, the Southwest Monsoon continuously affects Southern Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.

A total of **605 families** or **2,927 persons** are affected in **nine (9) barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA** and **IX** (see Table 1).
