



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Super Typhoon "Goring"

as of 28 August 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 27 August 2023 at 11PM, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) reported that the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Super Typhoon "Goring" may bring significant amount of rains to identified areas in the country within the next three days.

On the same day, several municipalities in the province of Occidental Mindoro and the municipality of San Enrique in Negros Occidental experienced flooding incidents due to the effects of the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Super Typhoon "Goring". *Source: DOST-PAGASA Weather Advisory No.7 and DSWD Field Office (FO)s*

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **932 families** or **3,767 persons** are affected in **19 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA and VI** (see Table 1).

1. Standby Funds

- ₱61.86 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱79.03 million available in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Super Typhoon "Goring" through inter-FO augmentation.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 129,902 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 26,468 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City, and 103,434 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 766,675 FFPs in DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the effects of the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Super Typhoon "Goring" through inter-FO augmentation.
- ₱1.2 billion worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO warehouses.
