

DSWD DROMIC Report #10 on the Effects of Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon “Falcon” as of 10 August 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 29 July 2023, the Tropical Storm “Khanun” has entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and was named “Falcon”. On 30 July 2023, “Falcon” intensified and became a Typhoon. As “Falcon” intensified while moving North Northwestward over the Philippine Sea, the Southwest Monsoon enhanced by Typhoon “Falcon” has brought occasional to monsoon rains over the western portion of Luzon and Visayas. “Falcon” left the PAR on 01 August 2023.

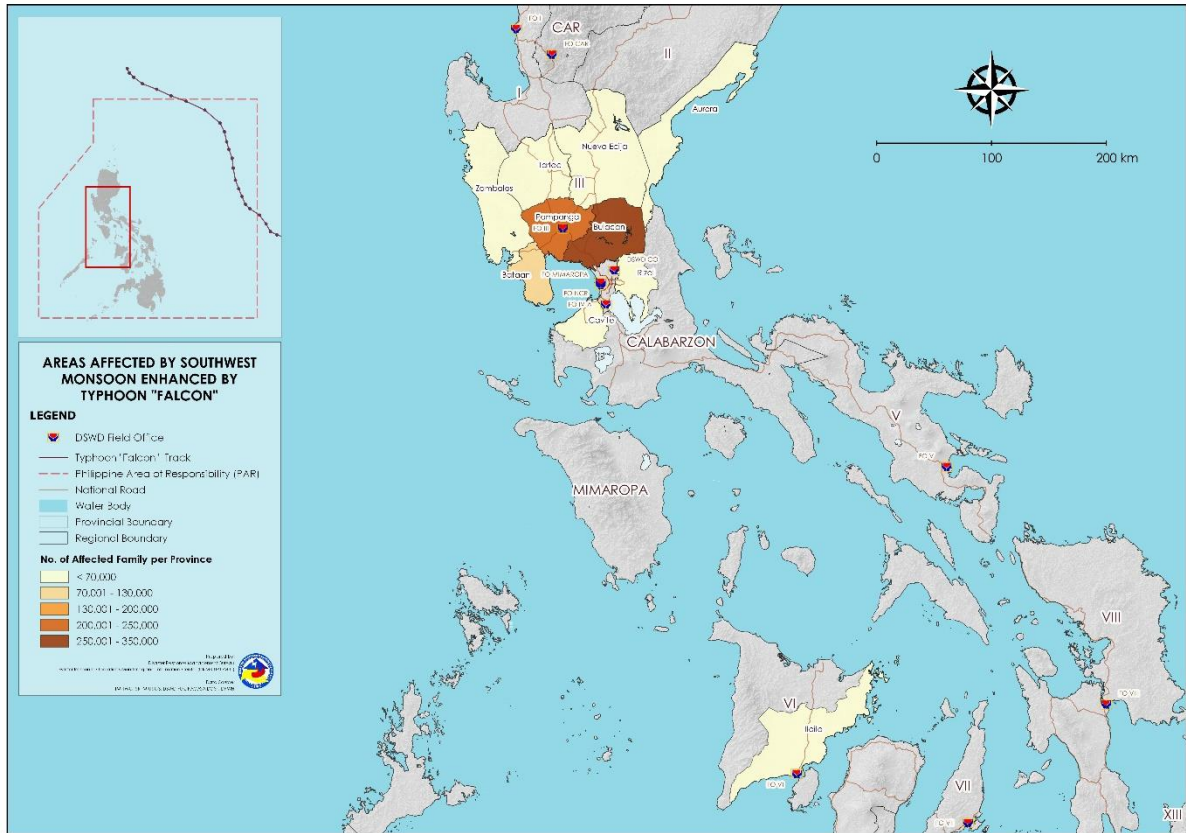

There are **4,628 families** or **16,449 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **231 evacuation centers** in **Regions III** and **CALABARZON** (see Table 2).
